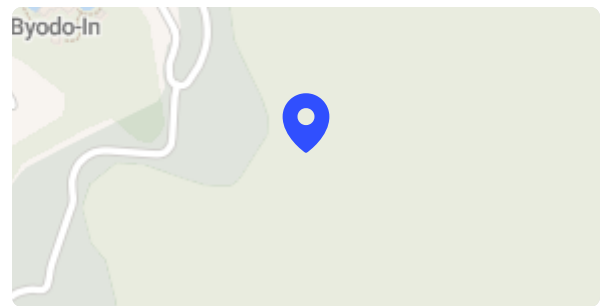

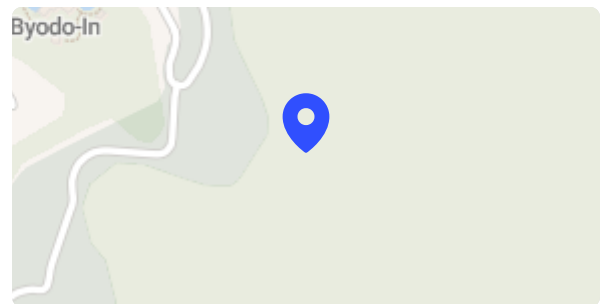

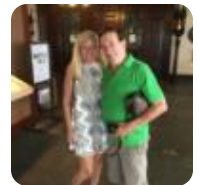
Sheri posted:
